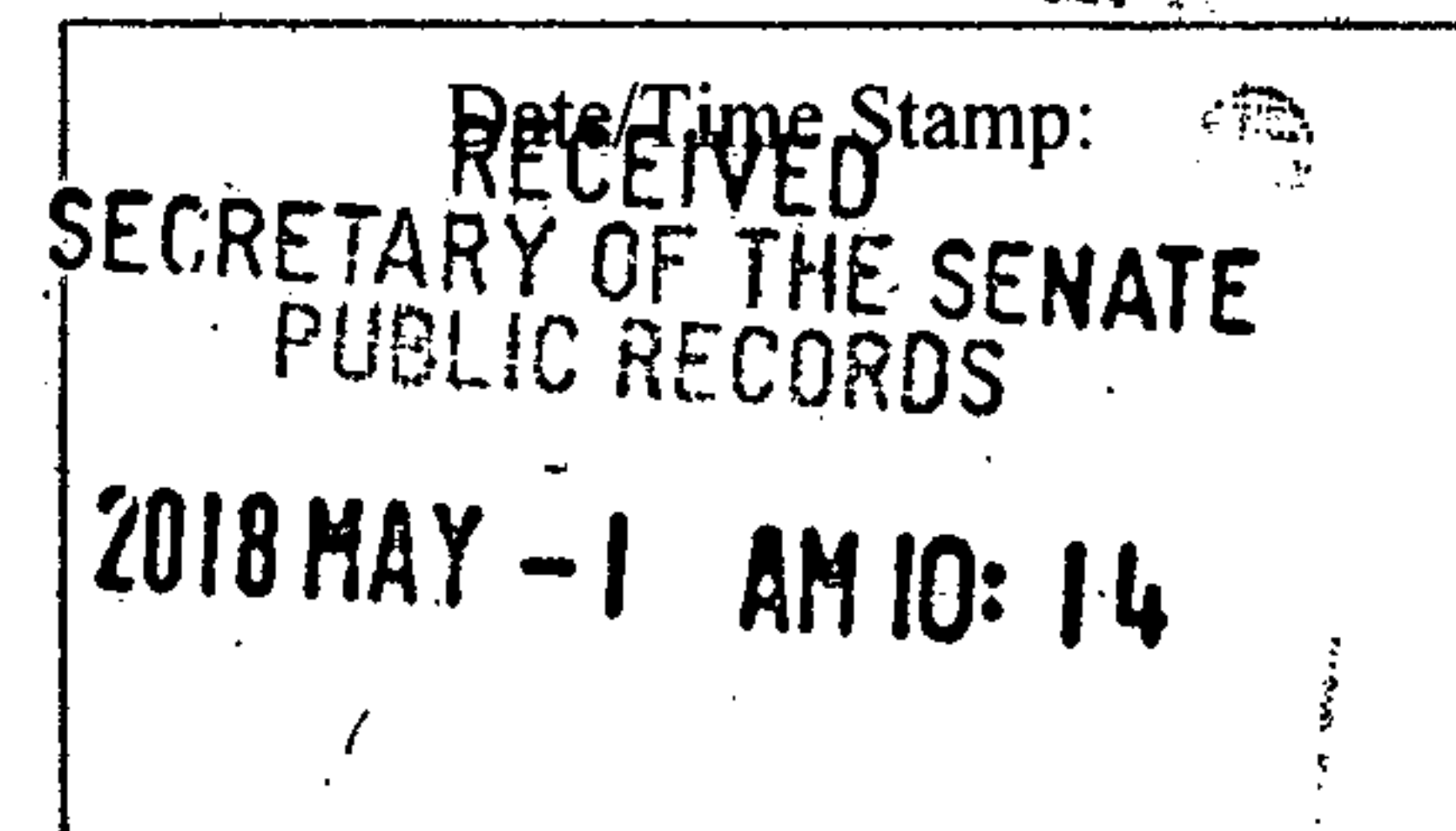





Question 12

TWS is funding, preparing staff, and organizing logistics and sponsors. Audubon is conducting the tour, WY logistics, and stakeholder invitations. PEW is providing funding, educational materials, and assisting with participant selection. TNC is providing funding and attending to provide landscape education.

Question 13

The Wilderness Society's mission is to protect wilderness and inspire Americans to care for our wild places. The Sage Grouse Conservation Plans are an excellent example of how various stakeholders can work together to solve complex problems that support and protect wild places while also allowing for development and economic activity. This trip supports The Wilderness Society's mission by educating staff members about the importance and success of the sage-grouse land management plans.

The Nature Conservancy has prioritized stabilizing and increasing populations of the Greater Sage-grouse (sage-grouse) across their range and supports the 2015 BLM land use plans to accomplish that goal. We will be attending the field trip and providing information both the Conservancy's work and information on sage-grouse habitat and populations.

Audubon's mission is to protect birds and the places they need, today and tomorrow. Audubon achieves this mission through collaborating with landowners, land managers, government agencies, and private industry across the hemisphere to increase the quality of habitat on private as well as federal managed lands to benefit 20 flagship bird species. This trip helps advance Audubon's mission by bringing together federal staff and highlighting the importance of collaborative conservation.

PEW's interest is to generate enhanced knowledge about the ecological values and management challenges in the sagebrush ecosystem and issues that affect the ecosystem and western public lands. This trip supports Pew's mission (to improve public policy, inform the public, and stimulate civic life) by better informing decision makers about the interior West's sagebrush ecosystem.

Question 14

Audubon and TWS have not sponsored trips before.

TNC has not paid for members or staff to travel to sites, but often provides educational tours of various preserves across the United States. For instance, on November 19, 2017 TNC provided Rep. Darren Soto and staff with a tour of the Disney Wilderness Preserve

in Poinciana, FL to provide educational information on wetland and upland habitat restoration.”

In the past, PEW hosted several Congressional trips. For example, a retreat in Richmond, VA from September 15-17, 2017 for Senate Chiefs of staff and also hosted a Reception at the Capitol on March 12, 2018 for Senate Chiefs of staff. On the House side, Pew organized a retreat in Philadelphia, PA from October 7-8, 2017 for Chiefs of Staff, and later hosted a Night at the Museum event at the Natural History Museum on March 3, 2018.

Question 15

As non-profit advocacy organizations, each of our groups participates an array of in events to educate legislators and staff on issues we care about. These activities include Congressional fly-ins, where we visit with legislators to discuss policy. Dear Pat,

We are excited to invite you to join us in Pinedale, Wyoming to tour a sage grouse lek and visit Jonah Energy. This event will be taking place April 3-5 and will provide you with the opportunity to see the sagebrush steppe ecosystem first hand, and hopefully view a sage grouse in their habitat.

As you know, the sage grouse is a bellwether species for the sagebrush, meaning the health of this important ecosystem is closely tied to and represented by the health of the bird. In 2015 the Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service completed land use management plans that instruct land managers on how to best protect sage grouse habitat.

The plans were a critical component to the 2015 decision by the US Fish and Wildlife Service to determine that bird did not warrant an endangered species listing. Knowing the many stakeholders and practices impacted by the plans, a variety of stakeholders were included in this monumental collaboration. To share insights into these uses, the lek tour will include opportunities to talk to Wyoming Fish and Game and Wyoming NRCS representatives, and Ranchers.

The visit to Jonah energy, just 20 minutes away, will help provide perspective on how industry and ecosystems can coexist, and how these collaborative plans help provide proven metrics and certainty to nearby businesses. Following the lek tour, we will see various activities that Jonah Energy practices in the field, viewing well pads and oil rigs.

Travel to and from Washington DC, and lodging in Pinedale, Wyoming, will be privately sponsored by The Wilderness Society, the National Audubon Society, The Nature Conservancy, and The PEW Foundation.
