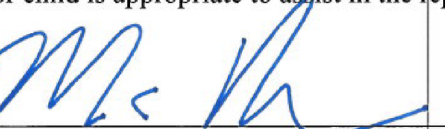

On behalf of the United Nations Foundation, I would like to extend an invitation to you to participate in a congressional learning trip to observe the work of the United Nations in Uzbekistan on April 9-16, 2022.

The United Nations in Uzbekistan is a robust presence, comprised of 25 agencies, funds and programmes working together—with U.S. and Uzbek partners—to reduce poverty, strengthen health systems, advance gender equality, safeguard cultural heritage, and respond to growing humanitarian needs. These efforts have produced significant results, enhancing Uzbekistan's prosperity and creating mechanisms of multilateral support for government-led reforms designed to liberalize the country's economy, enhance protection of fundamental human rights, and cultivate an independent civil society.

Over the course of this trip (draft agenda attached), the delegation will learn about these efforts via multiple site visits and high-level meetings, including with the UN Resident Coordinator in Uzbekistan, U.S. Amb. Daniel Rosenblum, and various other UN leaders and Uzbekistan government officials. The delegation, in addition, will travel to Termez, a city on the Uzbekistan-Afghanistan border to observe the work that UNICEF, UNHCR, WFP, and others are doing to deliver lifesaving humanitarian supplies to the Afghan people.

We would be honored if you would consider joining us for this unique learning opportunity. We kindly note that that you must have received all necessary doses of an authorized COVID-19 vaccine plus a booster (if applicable) to participate in this trip. **If you are interested in joining, please let us know as soon as possible as space is limited and the Ethics deadline is Wednesday, March 9.**

We hope you will take this opportunity to learn more about the UN's work and look forward to your reply.
