unscheduled meeting with a notable doctor regarding the work doctors are doing related to mental health addictions, including discussions of the substance abuse clinics in Israel and the mental health challenges Israelis face today (5:00 PM - 7:00 PM). The pre-travel itinerary for March 18 planned for breakfast at the hotel at 7:00 AM, that breakfast ended up being a substantive meeting with Jewish students who relayed stories of experiencing antisemitism of campus in the wake of October 7, 2023, as well as a volunteer medic that shared stories from the front lines in Gaza and discussed coping with the mental stress of war. The pre-travel itinerary for March 18 at 8:00 AM planned for a helicopter trip, that trip ended up including a substantive briefing en-route from members of the IDF. The pre-travel itinerary for March 18 at 11:45 AM planned for a visit of an IDF Iron Dome battery. That visit was cancelled due to security concerns (moved to March 19 at 9:30 AM). The pre-travel itinerary for March 18 planned for dinner at 8:30 PM, that dinner ended up being a substantive meeting with Relief Resources' executive leadership team regarding current activities in Israel and efforts to connect mental health professionals to clients. The pre-travel itinerary for March 19 at 10:00 AM planned for a tour of IDF Base Nahal Oz. The tour was cancelled because the base was closed to outsiders due to preparation for units to return to Gaza. The pre-travel itinerary for March 19 at 12:15 PM planned for a 15 minute visit to the Nova Festival site. That visit went for 60 minutes. The pre-travel itinerary for March 19 at 12:30 PM planned for a tour of IDF Base Julius. The tour was cancelled because the base was closed to outsiders due to preparation for units to return to Gaza. The BBQ lunch and tour of the Yahalom Unit HQ were cancelled for the same reason. The pre-travel itinerary for March 19 at 6:00 PM planned for a 60 minute meeting with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, that meeting went for 90 minutes. The pre-travel itinerary for March 20 planned for a visit of Mount Herzl at 2:00 PM, a visit of the National Library of Israel at 4:00 PM, a visit of the City of David at 5:30 PM, and a closing dinner with Israeli officials at 8:00 PM. These visits were cancelled due to the Tzevah Adom (Red Alerts) caused by incoming missiles fired at Jerusalem. Instead, travelers met with Foreign Minister Gideo Saar at the Foreign Ministry (originally scheduled for 12:30 PM, moved to 2:00 PM) and visited the Old City of Jerusalem and the Western Wall (originally scheduled for 7:00 PM, moved to 4:30 PM).

The inaugural Relief mission will focus on Israel's response to the mental health crisis following the October 7th terrorist attacks and the ensuing war. The trip will provide first-hand insights into how Israel is addressing the overwhelming demand for mental health services in the wake of unprecedented national trauma.
