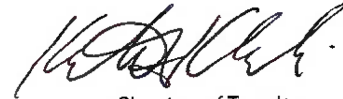

Explanation: Our Friday 8/8 Carbon to Sea briefing and tour aboard a boat was cancelled due to unsafe weather conditions. Instead, we invited the Carbon to Sea staff to give an interactive Q&A presentation over lunch that covered the same content as originally planned. We then took a short tour of the Reykjanes UNESCO Global Geopark. The tour was as an opportunity for staff to learn more about Iceland's geological history as a country with ongoing volcanic activity and how its citizens adapt to volcanic eruptions and develop resiliency policies. UNESCO is a United Nations agency. We also added an optional visit to the Sky Lagoon on the evening of Thurs 8/7. We received a request and input from the U.S. embassy staff that the site is educational and they often bring delegations from the U.S. Congress and other foreign dignitaries there as a means to learn about geothermal energy and Icelandic culture.

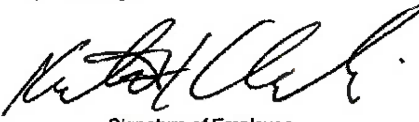

The 2025 Clean Energy Innovation Academy (CEIA) trip will bring Senate staff to Iceland to tour a number of innovative clean energy facilities such as the ON Power geothermal exhibition, Climeworks Mammoth Direct Air Capture Facility, Carbfix CO2 sequestration facility, Vaxa agriculture facility, Ljósafosstöð Hydropower Station, and the Reykjanes Geothermal Power Plant. Additionally, staff will participate in educational briefings with representatives from the U.S. Embassy in Iceland, the Icelandic Parliament and Ministry of Energy and Environment, and other private sector stakeholders like Business Iceland who are investing in clean energy technologies.

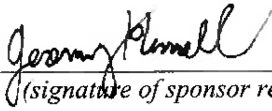
